Three Kings Festival Coming to Trinity!

On Sunday, January 7th, at our 9:30 AM worship we will be celebrating the *Festival of the Three Kings*. January 6th, Epiphany, is when the celebration is traditionally held. It is a festival that predates Christmas and now is often referred to as "Little/Second Christmas" across the western church. The festival commemorates the journey of the wisemen/magi to Bethlehem where they honor Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The *Festival of the Three Kings* is celebrated primarily in Spain, Latin America, Mexico and the Caribbean. Other countries celebrate it as well including the United States, especially where the Latin culture has a strong influence.

We are celebrating the festival this year and next because leap year will cause us to miss celebrating Epiphany for several years into the future.

Our celebration will have a Puerto Rican touch to it and will be followed by a pot-luck type luncheon featuring Puerto Rican dishes. Recipes are available at the church. This change will save Trinity money while providing a broader range of electronic services such as the use of credit/debit cards and Text2Give options. Also, the finance team believes that this move will position Trinity for the future regarding the increased use of electronic giving in support of the congregation's mission.

Phase I Meeting Results...

Dear Trinity Members,

Here are the voting results from the Phase I congregational meeting held on December 10th. A total of 40 ballots were received, 38 in-person and 2 virtual.

- 1. Regarding the minutes of the 2023 Phase II meeting held this past March -- 39 -- yes and 1 -- abstain.
- Election of 3 individuals for a 3-year term on Congregation Council -- Karise Mace, Molly Dubbs and Ann Towne were elected and each received 40 votes.
- 3. Election of 1 individual for an unexpired term on Congregation Council (2-years remaining) -- Randall Heffner was elected and received 40 votes.
- 4. 2024 Proposed Budget was approved (40 -- yes, 0 -- no and no one abstained.
- 5. The amendment to the Constitution to add a 10th position on the Congregation Council for a youth/young adult (15-29 years of age) of 1-year with a renewal possibility of 1-year was approved, 40-yes and 0-no. This same amendment will need to be passed a second time at the Phase II meeting and must receive a 2/3 majority of those voting on that occasion.

Dreibelbis Farm Presentation

On Saturday, February 3, 2024 at 2:00 p.m., the Dreibelbis Farm Historical Society will host a presentation of Pennsylvania German ice harvesting. The demonstration will include a demonstration of antique ice harvesting tools and (weather permitting)

cutting and harvesting ice blocks from the ice pond. We'll explain how ice was hauled to and loaded in the ice house. The first presentation will begin at 2:15; a 2nd presentation will be at 3:00. From Lutheran World Relief...

Your compassion makes beauty out of ashes in Ukraine. Not long after schools reopened after COVID, war disrupted Ukranian children's lives again. Some lost parents, others had to flee their homes, and nobody can tell them when – or if – life will go back to normal.

Congregations like yours are loving these children in many ways. First, you are providing safe refuge, basic supplies and nourishing meals at six sanatoriums. (In Ukraine, sanatoriums are like retreat centers that offer medical services. Today, many serve as shelters for the displaced.) To date, you have helped more than 10,000 people have at least one, if not many, safe nights of sleep.

But meeting physical needs is just the start. You're also fostering hope through counseling and psychological care. LWR's Tetyana Medvid, an expert in trauma and gender-based violence says, "These people have suffered ... Our task is to show them that life goes on."

Your compassion blesses children through art therapy sessions. By working with their hands, they can express their feelings and learn that they can create something beautiful, even when surrounded by war.

Keeping children's and families' spirits up is critical at this stage of the war, says the sanatorium's general manager Yurij Mosienko Borovyk. "They need support most of all," he says. "Moral support to give them hope."

Worship in Collaboration with Oglala Sioux Nation

On November 12, 2023, St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Birdsboro, PA, held their annual Native American worship service in honor of November being Native American Heritage Month. I attended the worship service and wanted to share my experience with you.

St. Mark's Lutheran Church has a partnership with the Oglala Sioux Nation of Native Americans in Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota, one of the poorest communities in the United States, and has been supporting them in many ways with their giving and their prayers.

In the worship service, the English translations used for the liturgy were:

Creator as the name used for God

Creator-Sets-Free as the name used for Jesus

The Chosen One as the name used for Christ

The Great Spirit as the name used for the Holy Spirit

The music for the worship service had a Native American vibe, words, and theme involving the sacredness of nature and life.

Copal incense from Central and Southwestern North America was used during the service as Native Americans used for sacred services.





Pr. Jim Farnsworth's message was dedicated to Native Americans and how the new immigrants treated them to America. He asked that we remember and honor those who have gone before us — the original inhabitants of this land. He also asked that we have a right relationship with God and each other and that we have a responsibility to repair relations. We reconcile by learning the truth, loving each other, and breaking down barriers with others. He suggested that we learn the history of our area by looking through the eyes of our neighbors and that we are called to be good neighbors.
