From the Pastor...

Dear Fellow Disciples,

"No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God (Lk. 9:62)." Jesus spoke these words to a man who promised to follow him after first bidding farewell to his family, a seemingly reasonable request. It seems uncharacteristically harsh coming from Jesus, but as someone who grew up on a farm, I know the problem one can get into plowing and looking backwards. It is important to keep one's eyes focused out ahead to a goal on the other side of the field, so it is in our faith journey as individuals and a congregation.

Over the next few weeks, we will be asking you to give some extra time to engage with God through the Holy Spirit and your fellow disciples in Christ concerning the nature of Trinity's ministry in the coming years. We will be asking you to think about

- > ways in which we can better equip each of us (God's people) to do God's work, and
- > ways we can continue to bring God's good news to hungry people.

In other words, we will be looking at ways in which we can strengthen and grow both our inward focused ministry and our outward focused ministry.

Here is what is in store for us:

- A GROWING YOUNG workshop on Saturday, February 4, from 9 AM until 3:30 PM where we will examine results of the Growing Young survey that individuals have been invited to take. It will provide an opportunity to discern the strengths and weaknesses of Trinity's current culture and start a conversation around what we can do to maximize our strengths and address our weaknesses. - An ALL MEMBERS CONGREGATIONAL PLANNING event on Sunday, February 26 (snow date of 3/5), following worship in the morning until 3:30 PM (please note the change of date). This will be an opportunity for us to gather and discuss what of our current ministries should continue, what ministries may need to change and what, if any, new things do we have the gifts and energy to undertake. A sign-up sheet for this event is on the pastor's office door.
- ✤ A CONSECRATION SUNDAY event during worship on Sunday, February 19th. On this day we will be invited to make our financial commitment to Trinity's ministries for 2023.

These 3 events along with an ongoing conversation regarding our worship life are important ways in which input from each of you will be important as together with God through the Holy Spirit we seek to discern and plan for the future God has in store for Trinity.

We have set our hands to the plow. Let us go forth in good courage focused on what lies ahead of us while giving thanks for what has been and supporting what is.

FriEDENS: An Amazing Garden Story

A few weeks after the lockdown in the spring of 2020, I called a neighbor in town who had a garden in her front yard. It's Shartlesville, and the PA Dutch are used to their yards looking *just so,* so I knew this was a brave woman who loved gardening vegetables more than public opinion. I also knew she didn't have room for pumpkins in her small yard, so I called and proposed we plant some viney crops up on our church property. She agreed and even had the seeds, gardening skills, and ideas, so after consultation with council, the garden was born. We sent our crop to the neighboring UCC congregation's food pantry, and with the excess had physically- distant free produce giveaways.

In 2021, we expanded the garden by half, to about 50 by 75 feet. We watered each plant via a recycled gallon milk jug with a pinprick in the bottom. The plants were happy, but our backs were not. It took 45 minutes to an hour to water all the jugs, which we did nearly every day because the garden is in full sun. The black plastic we used for weed suppression became a slip-and-slide while we irrigated.

In 2022, we were able to install a drip irrigation system that did not require filling milk jugs and weed suppression fabric that was not slippery. The fabric required using a blow torch to make holes for planting but will be able to be used for multiple years. The irrigation only required turning on the spigot and letting it run for several hours, which was a true God-send because we had some unexpected health issues on the garden team that limited our volunteer force! It was an extraordinarily dry summer, so the grant came just in time.

This past summer we had 21 people volunteer in the garden, took produce to 5 food pantries or senior centers, including Cafe Esperanza in Reading, and welcomed 29 people into the garden at a joint VBS. Not only are we feeding our neighbors with free, fresh, pesticide-free produce, but we are also getting to know our neighbors, developing new connections in the congregation among volunteers, teaching children about food insecurity and the joy of gardening, and passing on agricultural wisdom.
