From the Pastor...

Dear Disciples in Christ,

When you read this, we will be fully immersed in the season of Lent. It is a season of the church year that is based on the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness following his baptism and prior to setting out on his ministry of reconciliation. It is also a reminder of the 40 years the Israelites wandered in the wilderness between their exodus out of Egypt and their entry into the promised land.

The season begins on Ash Wednesday and ends the Saturday prior to Easter. It does not include the Sundays during that time, as Sundays are always focused upon Easter and celebrate the resurrection. The color of the season is purple. It was used as an act of derision toward Our Lord when Pilate placed a purple robe on Jesus, whom he called "King of the Jews". Thus for Christians, purple symbolizes Christ's pain, suffering and eventual death to redeem us and the world from our brokenness and sin.

During Lent we often use the word "journey" to identify the practice of self-reflection and discernment that the season encourages us to undertake. It is a practice that originated in the 11th century church. The journey of repentance is about "turning around" (the origin of the word) so that we might be in a right relationship with God. In a sense, we are looking for love to renew and reclaim us. When we look to God for love — not simply to the approval of others — and start with our own "turning," we participate in the "turning around" of the world.

I look forward to sharing this journey with each of you again this year. I pray that it will be a time of new life and renewal, not only for each of us individually, but also for Trinity, as together we prepare ourselves more fully to live out Christ's love for the world in this time and place.

On Sunday, February 12, we collected 2 special offerings. In response to the devastating earthquake and aftershocks that impacted a large area of Turkey and northern Syria, we raised \$582.63. The Global Missions Team at the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit, Emmaus, PA, led an advent appeal this past holiday season to support the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) at Arusha Lutheran Medical Center in Tanzania, which was established by ELCA medical missionary Dr. Mark Jacobson, and also had the opportunity to lead the church's worship services on their annual Global Missions Sunday, held this year on January 22, 2023, to share about this ministry with those in attendance.

When a baby is born prematurely in Tanzania, it is considered as good as dead. Premature babies there are often referred to as 'stillbirths.' This was not acceptable to the staff of Arusha Lutheran Medical Center. Fifteen years ago they began to offer neonatal intensive care, and pediatrician Dr. Steve Swanson joined the program in 2011. Initially they were only able to save 4% of the babies. Today they serve almost 400 babies annually, and the survival rate in 2022 was 92%.

The care at the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center NICU is the best in Tanzania, and in most of East Africa. No baby is turned away because of inability to pay or insurance status. The five doctors and 26 nurses who staff the NICU do not just care for the tiny infants, but for the parents as well. A hospital bed and meals are provided to every mother with a baby in the NICU and both parents are encouraged and coached on how to interact with their babies.

Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit raised \$3,785 from their Love for the Least appeal to be directed to the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center NICU in Tanzania, and 175 preemie knit or crochet hats were lovingly crafted for the NICU infants, which they hope to send to Tanzania. These hats can save lives by helping to keep the babies warm.
