From the Pastor...

Dear Fellow Disciples in Christ,

As you read this letter and the other items in this edition of *Trinity Together*, we will be entering the week that contains the festivals that define us as a people. What am I talking about? Holy week of course, that time from Palm Sunday through to Easter Sunday. It is believed that this week contains the earliest festivals of the Christian church. Certainly they are, as I said earlier in this paragraph, the festivals that define us as a people.

Palm Sunday is the day we remember that Jesus rode into Jerusalem as crowds gathered to meet him shouting hosanna and proclaiming him to be the one who comes in the name of the Lord. In recent years this day has also become a time for us to recall what happens to Jesus later in the week, namely his passion and suffering. This year we are planning to feature a liturgy titled, *The Cry of the Whole Congregation* which will take us through the events not only of Palm Sunday, but also of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Maundy Thursday is the day we remember the final meal that Jesus celebrates with his disciples before his death. **This year** we have 2 opportunities to gather on Thursday, 4/6, at noon or at 7 PM. We will recall that meal and how Jesus used the washing of feet to teach his disciples the importance of humble service as children of God. Both services will end with the stripping of the altar in preparation for Friday.

Good Friday is the day we remember Jesus' suffering and death upon the cross. Again on Friday, 4/7, we will offer the opportunity to gather at noon or 7 PM to hear Jesus' last words as he was hung upon a cross to redeem our broken and sinful world. He who knew no sin was made to suffer for our sin.

Finally, **Easter Sunday** is the day that we will gather to celebrate the good news that he who was dead has been made alive. **We will gather on Sunday**, **4/9**, **at 6:30 AM and/or 9:30 AM to proclaim the good news**, **Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!** Also that morning members of our Congregation Council and our Fellowship Team will prepare and serve a breakfast from 7:45 AM until 9:00 AM.

Make your participation in these remembrances a part of your plans. We are after all an Easter people sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever!

OUR FAITH IN ACTION

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Bangor had the vision to extend the use of our outdoor grove for our community. When the pandemic hit in 2020, we found that our grove provided a new opportunity to worship together before we opened for indoor worship in late fall. Our vision took on a new reason: to make the grove more accessible and available for more use to complement worship.

The first step identified was building a walkway to make the grove easy to enter and exit. We applied for a grant from the Synod Witness and Service Team Ministry and received it. (We also applied for a special ELCA grant but did not receive the ELCA grant.) As buying supplies became an issue, we needed to apply for a second Witness and Service grant. We received this grant in June of 2022, which enabled us to complete the walkway for our 50th Anniversary picnic and joint worship with Christ Lutheran Church in Mt. Bethel.

Since the completion, we have held several outdoor worship services.
