# From the Pastor...

Dear Fellow Disciples in Christ,

I pray that this article and newsletter find you well and preparing for a summer that will afford some time to relax and be renewed physically, mentally and spiritually. Susan and I have just returned from a wonderful trip to the Southwest portion of our country (California, Nevada, Arizona and Utah). We saw so many amazing sites. Feel free to ask us when you see us. We even have pictures 😂 ! However, that's not want I want to talk with you about in this letter.

The focus of this letter is the liturgy, that thing we experience every Sunday when we gather at Trinity to worship God. I begin with a simple question. What is the liturgy?

Merriam-Webster defines it as "a rite or body of rites prescribed for public worship." If we look back to its original roots in the ancient Greek, we learn that it stems from the Greek word "leitourgia" which literally means "work of the people". I like that definition because worship is our work as the people of God in which we lift our praise and thanksgiving to God for all that they have done and continue to do for us and the whole creation.

To be sure there are other styles of worship in the contemporary church scene, but I find that the interactive nature of our Lutheran worship helps me to feel like I have encountered God and been a part of a community that is in dialogue with God – both speaking and listening. Having attended churches that are non-liturgical, which I have done, I have departed feeling like I've been entertained, maybe heard God's word but really haven't worshiped God and been an active part of a faith community at worship.

The prayers, spoken or sung responses, times of silence for reflection, hymns of different varieties, idioms and time periods, the Scripture lessons being read, the preaching on one or more of the texts that were read and of course the celebration of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) serve to connect me to our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer in a way that doesn't happen when there is no liturgy – no prescribed rite to lead us to a fuller experience of God within me and around me.

On a recent Saturday morning back in the winter, nearly 30 members of our congregation gathered to think about worship and liturgy here at Trinity. What we heard was much like what I just shared. The liturgy is a means to connect with each other and with God. For some it is a healing experience. For others a challenging one. All noted that liturgy enables different folks to have different reactions to what has transpired, even in the same liturgy, and that different parts of the liturgy affect us differently at different times often dependent upon what we are experiencing in life at that time.

I hope this effort to talk about something that is near and dear to me is helpful for you as together we grow in our appreciation of God's presence and work in and through each of us.

# ELCA World Hunger...

Tatiane, now 24 years old and a mother of one, remembers eating primarily rice and beans as a child in her rural Kilombola community in southern Brazil. Rice and beans are staples for the Kilombola, but Tatiane and her family didn't have much variety beyond those foods. As Tatiane shared, "We didn't know what lettuce was."

Tatiane and those living in Kilombola communities are descendants of Afro-Brazilian enslaved people who fled cities and farms to live together and start new communities during the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. As a result, they have remained largely isolated from the rest of Brazilian society. They have struggled against inequality and neglect for centuries, often lacking such basic needs as running water, sanitation and health services.

A Brazilian partner of ELCA World Hunger helps Kilombola people claim their legal rights to basic public services by incorporating their communities as towns. This step empowers families to access schools for their children and the transportation needed to get there. This work, made possible in part by your generosity, doesn't stop there.

The trust built from these initial efforts enables ELCA World Hunger to further support the Kilombola as they build sustainable livelihoods and a healthier future for their communities. For Tatiane this meant agricultural training and a space for selling her surplus crops at the local market.

Much of the food grown in Tatiane's garden feeds fellow Kilombola families, increasing healthy options for the whole community. Having access to a diverse diet with many nutrient-rich options is a key step toward food security and long-term well-being.

ELCA World Hunger partners accompany communities such as the Kilombola all over the world. Thank you for your faithful partnership in this work.

### OF NORTHERN STITCHES, CONTAINER SHIPS, PORT CHAP-LAINS AND SEAFARERS: A JOURNEY OF HOPE THRU SIH

t is a Thursday morning at Calvary Lutheran Church in Bemidji, MN. Canada is just 107 miles away. The winter morning is brisk, 7 degrees, with a stiff breeze out of the north. This means it feels like way too many degrees below zero. For the 8 to 10 women who are here, cold temps, icy winds, even blowing snow can't keep them home. The call to serve others through the art and craft of quilting is too compelling. Colors surround them, blues and greens, browns and oranges, reds, yellows, floral and stripe, squares and scraps, piecing together discarded fabric into warmth which becomes shawts and tents, blankets, a wedding dress, maybe even a death wrap for those fleeing war or the ravages of climate change. But here in the north, it is simply the joy of community and service.

Today I imagine the journey the quilts will take, from the cold north to a warehouse, into a container bound for a need somewhere in the world. Ukraine or Lebanon? Mali or Burkina Faso? I imagine them loaded onto a train or truck on its way to a port, part of the *Seafarers International House* (*SIH*) network. Baltimore? Newark? *Seafarers international House* (*SIH*), the ELCA seafarers' ministry, has been that intersection where quilters from Bernidji, connect to a port chaplain, a seafarer, a dock worker loading up a container ship bound for somewhere across the Atlantic, through the Panama Canal, to places known and unknown.





For 150 years, hospitality and the welcome of strangers, support for seafarers and newcomers and refugees and immigrants, asylum seekers, this ministry has been a tapestry, a quilt, a piecing together of connection, support and a wayside rest. Perhaps some of the ancestors of these quilting women were assisted by SIH as they disembarked at Battery Park or Ellis Island, bound for a new home in a new land. This is what interests me on a cold Thursday morning, how the stitches of these women, intersect with a dock worker, a seafarer, a port chaplain, an asylum seeker. This is why I continue to financially support this ministry and serve on its board with great joy, imagining and underwriting the hope, the intersections of strangers around the globe, all uniquely made possible through SIH.  $\pm$
