From the Pastor...

Dear Disciples in Christ,

What follows is an interesting connection between **addiction and scarcity** that has implications with respect to our being good stewards of God's many blessings. I came across it in an online stewardship publication I receive and am sharing it as my letter this month. It was written by a seminarian who is a recovering alcoholic. I hope you find it thought provoking.

I'm an alcoholic. I haven't had a drink in many years. I believe that by the power of God and with the supportive people in recovery, I have been taught how to live. Quitting drinking wasn't the only issue—I needed to learn how to live without drinking.

Though I've been sober a number of years, I learn something new about addiction and recovery every year. Normally when I'm trying to learn something else, I am opened up to new ways of seeing how addiction has played a part in my life. Recently at Luther Seminary, I was in Grace Pomroy's class "Money and Mission of the Church." We were discussing scarcity and abundance.

In our reading for that class, Walter Brueggemann caught my attention with his *Christian Century* article: "The Liturgy of Abundance, the Myth of Scarcity." Brueggemann writes, "Because Pharaoh, like Hitler after him, is afraid that there aren't enough good things to go around, he must try to have them all. Because he is fearful, he is ruthless. Pharaoh hires Joseph to manage the monopoly. When the crops fail and the peasants run out of food, they come to Joseph. And on behalf of Pharaoh, Joseph says, 'What's your collateral?' They give up their land for food, and then, the next year, they give up their cattle. By the third year of the famine they have no collateral but themselves. And that's how the children of Israel become slaves -- through an economic transaction." I was astounded because this is exactly how addiction works.

Whatever we are addicted to takes us piece by piece until we become its slave. This notion of scarcity—the fear of not having enough—pulls and pulls us into this myth of scarcity. I hadn't ever thought of scarcity playing a role in addiction until I was reading Brueggemann.

When I started drinking, I wasn't automatically an alcoholic. I became an addict in much the same way the Israelites became slaves. You see, when I drank, I felt like I was a different person; I felt like I fit in; I felt like I was finally enough. So, I'd go back to my addiction, and it would ask, "What's your collateral?" And I'd pay by giving up some time with my friends. Then, I'd go back and be asked again, "What's your collateral?" As years went by, I gave up money, I gave up time with my family, I gave up values, I gave, and I gave. I could never sate my addiction; I couldn't get enough, so I kept giving and giving until—just like the Israelites—my addiction had all of me and I was a slave.

When I was in active addiction, I didn't understand that I was enough exactly the way I was; I didn't understand that God was all about abundance. Just like Israel learning to trust God that there was enough, I had to learn to trust God that I was enough. I needed to trust that I was made through the grace of God's abundance.

Eventually I learned, I am enough.

Lutheran World Relief Donations at Work in Uganda...

Suzan Nzabake toiled on her farm, day in and day out, trying to grow coffee and vanilla the best way she knew how. But the flowers kept dropping off her plants before the fruit had a chance to develop, making her harvests too small to keep her family fed.

As a result, Suzan and her extended family of eight went to bed hungry every night on the floor of a small mud shack. Stuck in extreme poverty, hunger created a domino effect on her family, leaving Suzan's children without the strength and energy to succeed in school. Their diminished immune systems left the children vulnerable to lifethreatening illnesses – and less likely to survive.


Suzan would often eat just once a day so her children could eat twice. She was so weak from hunger, when she recently came down with malaria, it took a very long time for her to recover.

Suzan prayed fervently for a better future. "The Bible says you should ask God for what you desire," she explained. "And I prayed that he would bless me through my land."

Your love answered Suzan's prayers with emergency food, as well as the tools and knowledge she needed to help her crops – and her family – thrive. Your generosity introduced Suzan to vermicomposting (the use of earthworms to convert organic waste into fertilizer) to treat her plants and keep them healthy.

Today, Suzan's family not only has enough to eat, but her income and her hope for the future have both risen exponentially. As Suzan explains, "I really see that God is answering our prayers. My children no longer cry all the time. They no longer get admitted to the hospital. Today, I have peace knowing that I have friends overseas who love me. That's why I keep praying to God to uplift them."

Your far-reaching love is ensuring Suzan can feed her children so they are healthy enough to succeed in school and reach their full potential in life.

* 2023 Update on Portico Health Rates & Plan Changes

ELCA-Primary health contribution baseline rate will increase 3%, the same rate increase as last year, which was the lowest in eight years. The 3% increase also applies to sponsored members receiving the ELCA Medicare-Primary health benefit Standard option. ELCA-Primary Gold+ option deductibles will increase to \$1,500 for member only, \$2,250 for member and child(ren) and \$3,000 for member and spouse or member, spouse, and child(ren). Coinsurance, out-of-pocket limits and prescription drug cost-share will not change.

X Prepare for 2023 Annual Enrollment

As you prepare to make selections in October, keep these things in mind: Sponsoring employers (congregations and organizations) will select the option they will offer their employees Oct. 3-14. Your registered EmployerLink user can access the 2023 Decision Guide and their Custom Comparison Report to help determine 2023 costs and options. Note: any organization that does not make a selection will be assigned Silver+ (A) to offer their plan members the ability to choose the coverage that works best for them. Sponsored members, watch for an email from Portico with specific information about 2023 for Annual Enrollment, including when your selection period will be
