From the Pastor...

Dear fellow Disciples,

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:1-2)

Back in mid-August I invited those who worshiped in person and virtually to think of individuals who have served or continue to serve as examples of faithfulness for them in their journey of faith. Those who were attending in person that day received a little cloud upon which to write their names. After putting a name or names on their cloud they were invited to put them on the walls and furnishings throughout the sanctuary. They continue to adorn our walls and furniture.

On the first Sunday of November, the 6th, All Saints Sunday, we will have the opportunity to remember those individuals of our congregation who have died since last All Saints Sunday, as well as those individuals who played a significant role in our lives and are now at rest in Christ Jesus whether they died in the last year or years ago. It is a significant day in the church year for it serves to remind us that we are never alone and that our hope in Christ Jesus is not for this life only. As the writer of *Hebrews* said so eloquently, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us (12:1)."

While sorrow will lie close at hand on the 6th, especially for those of us who remember the recent death of a loved one, we will not mourn as those who have no hope. Rather trusting in Christ the Resurrected One we will be able to find strength in our memories so that we can continue to run the race they so ably began.

For all of God's saints, living and dead, let us give our thanks and praise!

The Congregation Council decided at its last meeting that any money received through the campaign by the end of November will be put to the first year's interest and principal in December prior to the end of the congregation's fiscal year.

If you made a commitment to the **STARTING A NEW CHAPTER** capital campaign and have not remitted your first year's commitment or if you want to make a contribution this year and have not done so, you are encouraged to make your gift by Sunday, November 27, to ensure that it will be counted and deposited by the 30th of the month.

It will enable Trinity, not only to enhance its music ministry, but also to become a more welcoming place for those who have mobility challenges.



what's happening with Growing Young?

Growing Young is an initiative lived out in the NEPSynod, congregations, and individuals' ministry. Growing Young was our synod assembly theme in 2021, but it is not a once-and-done theme. Growing Young is something we strive to accomplish together, continually.

Congregations throughout our synod have been diving deep into the journey of Growing Young. Some are just beginning and exploring the concept whereas others are already incorporating it within their congregation and even helping beginners to gain the whole Growing Young experience. In case you are new to Growing Young, Growing Young is a movement in the NEPA Synod and throughout the greater ELCA and is based on a book of the same name. The book studied churches of all sizes, denominations, and locations throughout the country that are maintaining and engaging youth and young adults in their congregations. What does Growing Young really look like though?

Growing Young will look different for every congregation and the journey to get there will not be the same. Devoting time and commitment to the 6 core characteristics is the only way for your congregation to work towards a Growing Young outcome. These commitments orbit around a Jesus-centered community and help us truly become the church. Now is the time to pass down leadership and pastoral roles to those eager to assist and prioritize youth & young families everywhere. Now is the time to focus on warm relationships and empathize with today's youth. Now is the time to be the best neighbor and share Jesus' message seriously.
