From the Pastor...

Dear Disciples in Christ,

"My husband and I recently purchased a house in Allyn, WA and we have been working over the last few months to make that house a home. We weeded the yard, painted the walls, purchased tools for the garage, and put away countless boxes of stuff we didn't know we had. The concept of ownership is a key part of the home buying process. We were reminded again and again that this house was "ours," all of the boxes of stuff were "ours," even the walls we painted were "ours" and we could decide what to do with them.

But these things aren't really ours, they are God's. Every part of this house, every part of our new community, every part of me belongs to God. Even though I believe this and know it to be true, I often need to be reminded, especially in seasons like this. I'll admit that I still don't know all of what this change in mindset and ownership will mean for our house. How is God calling us to steward well God's house, God's tools, God's walls? I'm not exactly sure yet, but I don't want to shy away from the discomfort of sitting with that question." – Grace Pomeroy, *Director of Luther Seminary's Stewardship Leaders Program*

I don't know about you but Grace Pomeroy strikes close to home for me (pun not intended) when she asks the question, "Who is really the owner of all that we usually call ours?" So often we forget that all we have and think of as our own or of our own making/earning is really God's. During the first 3 Sundays of November, we will be looking at what it might mean for us to live believing that God is the owner of all that we call ours corporately and individually.

On November 5th we will hear the words of Jesus teaching us about what it means to be blessed.

On November 12th as we gather to celebrate the baptism of Quinn and Rebecca Giligan's infant daughter, we will be invited to reflect upon what makes one wise or foolish.

Finally, on November 19th, Consecration Sunday, we will be reminded that it isn't sufficient to just maintain what we have been given but to make good use of the gifts God has given to us, corporately and personally. Those in attendance will be invited to make their commitment towards supporting the work of Trinity in 2024 as we seek to embrace God's future for our congregation and each of us individually.

In preparation for these weeks of learning and reflection, you will be receiving a commitment card and a brochure highlighting our goals for next year. There are three.

- 1. *Embracing God's Future* which means ensuring that we provide the appropriate resources and support as Vicar Seth Noggle and our new staff configuration and members enter into their new roles of leadership.
- 2. Praising God through Inspiring Worship which means that along with our staff and volunteer worship leaders we will not only maintain a tradition of inspirational worship, but also add new elements to what has been done in the past that will inform and inspire our service in the community and beyond.
- 3. *Growing Young and Strengthening our Fellowship* which means that we will purposefully incorporate in our teams and mentor the next generations of disciples in Christ so that they can share more fully in the mission of Trinity and other congregations where they may become members.

Vicar Seth and I invite you to join us over these next weeks as we gather to offer our praise, prayers and thanksgivings to the God who has given us all that we call our own and invites us to use our gifts as a blessing to others.

Adult Sunday School

The Adult Sunday School Class welcomes you to join us in enjoying "God's Law is Love," a program that invites us to bridge the gap between Old Testament law and New Testament love. We will explore the struggle in New Testament texts with the significance of Mosaic law for those who trust in and love Jesus Christ. Jesus shows us how compassion is always essential when interpreting the law. First, we will look at Luke and John to see Jesus' roots in in the justice and love of God; and compassion versus rigorous application of law. Second, we will see in Paul's epistles to Romans and Galatians the justification by faith, and how the law tells us what to do but not how to do it. Third, we consider in Acts. Corinthians, Romans and Colossians, the fulfillment of law in the commandment to love, and the revelation of God in Christ. Rev. Phil Ruge-Jones, an ELCA pastor in Wisconsin who recounts the gospel of Mark from memory, will help us understand how the expansion of the good news causes us to rethink our relationship to the law. 

Have you ever worked on a crochet or knit project, and got to a point where your yarn ends up tied in a bird nest-looking mess? Or maybe you're one that works with a fishing line, and while re-spooling a reel you end up with a knot with loops and swoops that make you scratch your head and wonder, "Now what?"

I've noticed that when I experience the dilemma of a knotted skein, I feel frustration and anger. If I'm not in my clearest headspace, I will reactively pull one loop at a time, looking for one with any ability to move. "This one moves? Great!" I'll pull it in either direction until it stops. Still knotted? Find another! And again, and again. If I'm not careful I can end up tightening the knot even further, never to be unwound and destined for the scrap pile.

On my clearer days, I can take a jumbled mess of a knot and get it unwound and collected into a smaller ball of yarn without even needing to cut it from the rest! In Times like this, I have found, that the frustration and the anger are still present, yet in letting them pass while I pause, I create the opportunity to take care and intention in my untangling.

I wonder if God feels like that sometimes when, as the interconnected, diverse, and wild Creation that God so deeply loves, we get ourselves all knotted up through broken relationships, judgments, and ignorant acts. I wonder, does God reactively start pulling at us to take action? Does God accept our jumbled mess, allowing us to make different choices and seek right relationships that honor our connectedness? Does God enjoy the feeling of seeing us come together to co-create something new and beautiful?

May you know and trust that the One who has knit you together in the womb is the One who is eager and ready to create goodness and mercy in and through you this day and always. Blessings on your detangling.
